We are open for limited browsing during our open hours:

The Rules: Enter at the William Street front entrance. There is a sign-in station, hand sanitizer and masks, if you forgot yours. Wearing a mask is required. We ask that you wear gloves, which we will provide, to handle the library materials. Sneeze shields are in place at the circulation desk. You will be exiting on the Shethar Street side. The parking lot is easily accessible from both sides of the building.

<u>Inside the Library</u>: Right now hanging out for any reason, such as reading, using your own or the library's laptops, using the copier yourself, using the restrooms, spending time in the Children's play area is not allowed. As these features become available, we will let you know by posting it on the website and on facebook.

Outside the Library: Our WIFI is available 24/7 and accessible on the patio and in the parking lot. The network and password are posted on the front and back doors.

Interlibrary loan within our system is available. Log onto STARCat and place a hold to your account, or call us at 569-2045 with your requests. Out-of-system loans are not available as of yet.

Curbside Service is still an option. Please let us know if you prefer to pick your materials up at the door. You may place holds on line, or call us with your requests. When we have them ready, we will check them out to you, let you know they are here. You can knock on the front door on William Street and will hand you your materials.


