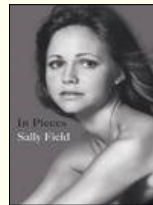

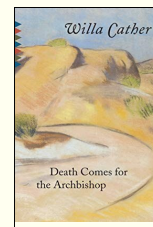

In this intimate, haunting literary memoir & *NY Times* Notable Book of the year, an American icon tells her own story for the first time.

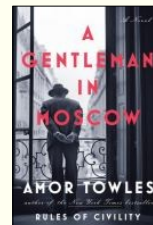


August 12, 2019

Death Comes for the Archbishop,

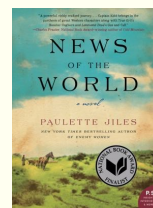
by Willa Cather
