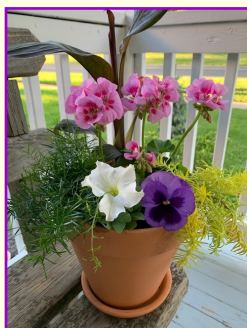

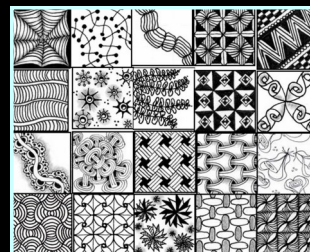

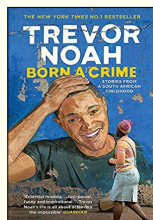

## Hammondsport Book Discussion Group

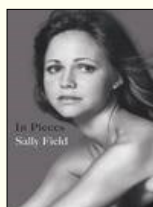
The library book discussion group meets

**Born a Crime: Stories from a South African Childhood**, by Trevor Noah

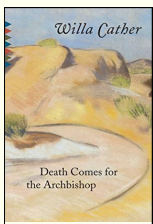
Mischievous young boy to restless young man finding himself in a world where he was never supposed to exist.
